

# NORTH AMERICAN INTERCOLLEGIATE Dairy Challenge™ *Tomorrow's Dairy Leaders*

Dear Coaches,

On behalf of the National Program Committee of the North American Intercollegiate Dairy Challenge, it is our privilege to invite your university to participate in the 12<sup>th</sup> Annual NAIDC. The event will be held in Fort Wayne, Indiana on April 4 – 6, 2013 hosted by Michigan State University, The Ohio State University and Purdue University.

The North American Intercollegiate Dairy Challenge offers a two-day competition that enables four-person teams to evaluate a well-managed dairy farm business and then recommend management enhancements to a panel of judges comprised of industry and academic professionals. We believe this to be the premier dairy event in the country for undergraduate students and work hard on behalf of the students to support the program.

## Participation

- This event is limited to the first 32 teams who register and teams are limited to 4 students that have not previously participated in the National Contest. Completed entries will receive priority by date, time of receipt and previous participation in the contest.
- If we do not meet the 32 team maximum, aggregate teams will be formed. If you do not have enough students to create a team, please complete an entry form for those interested in being placed on an aggregate team. If you have a team, and are interested in possibly having a fifth student participate on an aggregate team, please include their information on the entry form as instructed.

- For those of you who have or are planning to participate in a regional contest, you will be familiar with the contest materials on a USB thumb drive rather than printed in a binder. If your team is not participating in a regional event, you may obtain a copy of the thumb drive material from a regional event to familiarize yourselves with the content and layout.

### Travel Information:

- Hotel reservations will be made for your team after the entry form is completed and returned to the North American Intercollegiate Dairy Challenge, 3310 Latham Drive, Madison, WI 53713.
- The student/coach hotel is the Hilton Fort Wayne and the Grand Wayne Convention Center, 1020 S. Calhoun Street, Fort Wayne, IN. Phone: (260) 420-1100. Website: <http://www.hiltonfortwayne.com/>.
  - Up to three hotel rooms (2 student, 1 coach) will be reserved for each participating team for the evenings of April 4, 5 and 6. Rooms for the students will be paid for by the contest. **Rooms for coaches are the school's responsibility, as well as any additional charges.** Rooms at the Hilton Fort Wayne are **\$89/night** plus tax single occupancy. When checking in, we kindly ask that you confirm the rooms that will be for your students (paid for by NAIDC), and the room that will be for you as the coach (paid for by the individual). Please indicate on your form if you plan to have a roommate (including a coach from another school) so we can book accordingly.
- The committee is suggesting your team arrive at the hotel **no later than 5 p.m. on Thursday, April 4**. Computers must be turned in by this time. Registration will be open at this time as well. After turning computers in and completing your registration, feel to grab supper. All teams must be back and present by 8 p.m. Thursday evening for data distribution and review of contest procedures. Teams should plan to depart on Sunday, April 7.
- A Pre-Contest Farm Tour will be offered again this year on Thursday before the contest begins. If your team is participating, you may wish to arrive in Fort Wayne on Wednesday night. Thursday's program begins with a Pre-Tour seminar from 10 a.m. - 12 p.m., followed by lunch and the tour which begins at 12:30 p.m., ending at 3:30 pm. Please indicate on the attached Entry Form your plans for participating in Thursday's activity. You must register in advance for lunch on Thursday.
- Teams arriving on Wednesday night are responsible for making their own hotel reservations. A block of rooms has been set aside at the Hilton Fort Wayne. You may reserve rooms for your team by calling them directly at (260) 420-1100. Charges for this additional night are the responsibility of the team. Rooms are \$89 per night. Likewise, teams are responsible for their own transportation to the farms on Thursday. We encourage carpooling on Thursday to minimize the number of vehicles traveling to each farm.
- Travel assistance amounts are based on distance to the contest site. This year, teams that are flying may receive up to \$600 of travel reimbursement for the entire team. Teams that are driving may receive up to \$600 of travel reimbursement (round trip) at \$0.50 per mile for the entire team.

- For those planning to fly to the Dairy Challenge, the nearest airport is Fort Wayne International Airport. For a list of airlines and rental car agencies that serve that airport, go to: <http://www.flyfwa.com/>.

The Hilton Fort Wayne offers shuttle rides to the airport as well as van rides to popular select venues within a five-mile radius.

### **Meals**

- Breakfast, lunch and dinner will be provided for one coach and up to four team members on the days of April 5 - 6. Should you have a member needing a special diet, please include this information on the contest entry form so we can alert the catering staff. Also, teams that bring more than one coach will need to pay the full price for the additional meals (\$170) in advance of the contest or at registration. If an additional sleeping room is required, it is up to the university to make and pay for that reservation.

Please complete the attached entry form and return it to NAIDC by **February 15, 2013** with a check payable to North American Intercollegiate Dairy Challenge. Completed entries will receive priority by date and time of receipt and previous participation in the contest if contest size limits are reached. A confirmation letter with more contest details will be sent upon receipt of your registration material.

**Special Note:** Please advise your students not to wear clothing with a university's name or logo during the contest.

A final letter will follow after February 15<sup>th</sup> with additional details and student forms to be completed and returned before the Dairy Challenge. We look forward to your participation in this exciting and innovative contest.
