Computers

- Two computers per team will be needed for the contest.
 - These computers do not have to be checked in
 - Students are encouraged to bring their own computers as well
- Dairy One will be supplying an inventory of computers for the Contest and Academy
 - pre-loaded with the herd data in DairyComp 305, PCDART and DHI Plus programs and all other herd data
 - Students are allowed to move herd data information onto their student computers. However, financial info is provided in printed form.
- School computers will primarily be used to view contest materials and prepare presentations
- Each contest team will also be provided with a USB thumb drive that can be used to transfer files between computers. Teams will save their final presentation on the provided thumb drive and return it at the end of the day on Friday.
- Schools are not required to bring computers for the Academy students.
 - Academy students are however encouraged to bring their own computers for their use during Academy prep

Internet

- Students may use the internet as a tool in their presentation preparation.
 - Students should be reminded that while internet is allowed,
 we can't always guarantee it's availability that is real world.
- The purpose of allowing student computers and internet access is to provide a more real-world experience with access to additional resources to help address specific questions that arise during the farm analysis.
- In addition, there are no restrictions this year on the use of pre-planned repositories for contest resources or on what dairy management resources are brought to the contest for use in preparing presentations.

Other tools

- Cameras: If your school has a camera, please bring it.
 - Be sure to bring the cables, cords, etc.
- Use of cell phone, IPad, or other similar cameras is prohibited at the farms and during the contest.
- Schools should bring a calculator, measuring tape, watch/stopwatch, pens and clean notepads.
- Contest students are NOT to wear clothing with identification of their respective school any time during the event.

Herds

- 1 herd is Jersey
- 3 herds are Holstein
- 1 herd process their own milk
- Largest herd is 6000 cows
 - Students should be aware of this as they plan their time at the farm. They will have 2 ½ hours on the farm.
 - The Jersey herd will not have all cows present at the facility. We will not be going to the other facility.

Herd Data

- All 2017 herds have original data in DC305
- Data will stay in DC305
- Other programs—PCDART, DHI Plus will have herd data, except for health events...these don't transfer accurately
 - Health events by month and DIM will be provided as an Excel Spreadsheet
 - Encourage students to look through herd data spreadsheet end to end. It will be large and there will be a lot of data on it.
 - One dairy processes at DRMS, so that farm will have the dairy metrics report. It is done on a regional basis for this event.

Diets

- PSPS for High Group diet and prefresh/closeup group
- Copies of all diets will be provided
 - Actual forage samples will be at the farms, along with the number data.
 On the data paper the nutritionist will indicate screen number version they used. Ration data is all PDF.
- Map to match group to ration (be sure to thank Coleen Jones for this!)

Additional Data

- Novus Cow Comfort Assessment for 2 herds
- Zinpro Assessment for 2 herds
 - Zinpro assessment is mostly data, hoping to get a sample report posted on the web site so students can see what it looks like.
- California benchmarks will be supplied
- February is the test date for DHI data
 - Several documents are on the <u>web site</u> now, including benchmarks to help students.
 - The NAIDC Board will be reviewing how much information we give students in the future. Some coaches feel these reports can provide "too much" information for the students, hoping the students know how to do these calculations rather than rely on these reports.

HERD COMPARISON REPORT

Explanation of Terms

This report provides a comparison of selected management statistics for your herd with your peers. Use this comparison to identify management items that could be improved to make your dairy more profitable. Also, become aware of your management strengths. The groupings to compare your herd with are the State, Local Association and other similar sized herds. The herd size groupings are <250, 250-499, 500-749, 750-999, 1000-1499, 1500-1999, and >1999 cows. For Jersey herds the size grouping is replaced by all Jersey herds. The number of herds in each grouping is listed at the top of the report. Be aware that the values listed are averages for the group and there may be substantial variation among the herds.

Contest

- Prep time 1 hour prior to presentation has been eliminated
- Students will gather in a holding area 15 minutes prior to presentation and will be escorted to presentation room.
- Financials will be turned in at this point in time.
 - Coaches are encouraged to remind students Saturday morning to bring their financials to the holding room.

Contest

- One presentation check in time on Friday afternoon, window from 5:45-6:15 rather than assigned turn in times
 - This change should minimize student stress and give them more time to get ready for dinner.
 - Students will be interacting with sponsors Friday evening and should view it as a potential job interview. Encourage them to look appropriate for that evening.
 - Dinner with sponsors was pushed back to a 7 PM start time. Students will select a dinner table that matches their interest.
- Presentation format: Cannot use Google presentation, must use Powerpoint.
 - Students may prepare their presentation using any software; however it is required that they save the final version to submit in Powerpoint.
 - It should not matter whether students prepare their presentations in widescreen (16:9) or standard (4:3) slide size.

Dress Code
