

2022 North American Intercollegiate Dairy Challenge & Academy Thursday, March 31 – Saturday April 2, 2022 KI Convention Center in Green Bay, Wisconsin Hosted by University of Wisconsin-Madison, Fox Valley Technical College, and the Midwest Regional Dairy Challenge Planning Committee

The Board of Directors of the North American Intercollegiate Dairy Challenge invites you to join us for our in-person 20th Annual Dairy Challenge and the 9th Annual Dairy Challenge Academy. These events will be held in Green Bay Wisconsin, March 31-April 2, 2022 and hosted by University of Wisconsin-Madison, Fox Valley Technical College and the Midwest Regional Dairy Challenge Planning Committee.

The North American Intercollegiate Dairy Challenge offers a two-day competition that enables four-person teams to evaluate a well-managed dairy farm business and then recommend management enhancements to a panel of judges comprised of industry and academic professionals. The Academy runs in conjunction with the contest, offering students an intensive program using the educational component of the Dairy Challenge without the competition.

We are building our list of volunteers to help with the event on Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Being involved and working directly with the students gives you a first-hand view of the students in action, plus a large volunteer pool helps the event run smoothly.

For 2022, you'll find many opportunities to work directly with students, including:

• Dairy Challenge Academy: educational program offered to as many as 150 sophomores, juniors, and seniors from 4-year dairy programs, as well as undergraduates from community colleges and technical schools. We need as many as 40 professionals from varied backgrounds to serve as Academy Advisors by sharing their knowledge of dairying and guiding groups of students through a dairy analysis. - Contest volunteers: help guide students during their farm visit, monitoring workrooms and presentation rooms, etc.

REGISTRATION: Volunteer attendees should submit the <u>Volunteer Registration Form</u> by March 8; then check in at the Dairy Challenge Central office at the KI Convention Center upon your arrival. You will be given your registration packets and name badges.

MEALS: Meals are a considerable portion of our expense each year. To allow us to use sponsor funds to support our student participants, we are asking each volunteer to contribute toward the cost of their meals during the event. We are asking for a \$10 donation for each lunch (offered Fri and Sat) and \$20 for each dinner (offered Fri and Sat) you plan to attend. If you plan to arrive on Thursday to attend the optional pre-contest tour, both lunch and dinner will be offered. Total contribution for meals would be \$30 per day.
